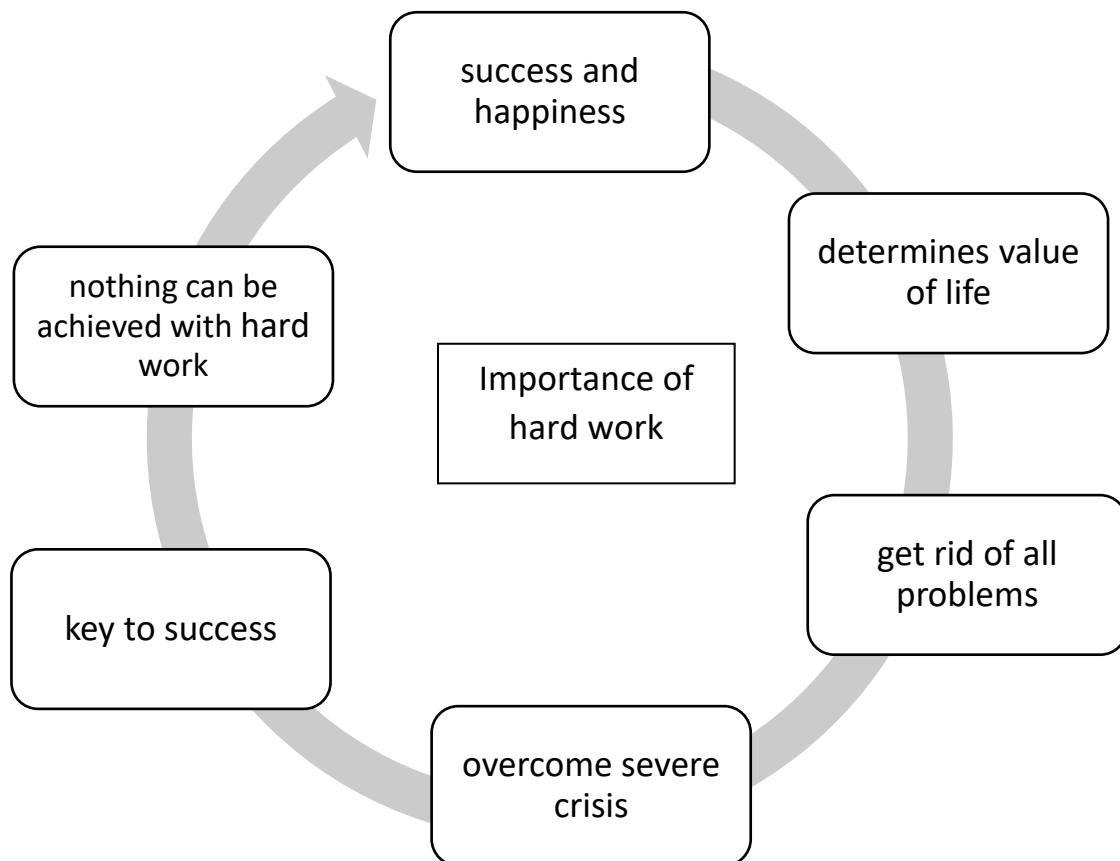

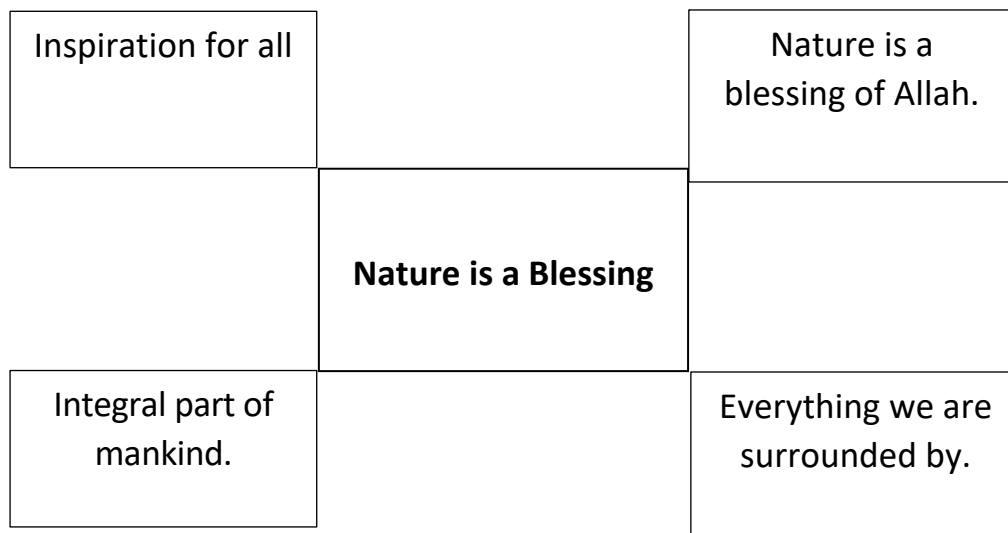

Captain Raja Muhammad Sarwar. He belonged to the Punjab Regiment. He was the commanding officer in the Uri sector when on the night of July 27, 1948, he received a direct burst of enemy gunfire and embraced martyrdom.

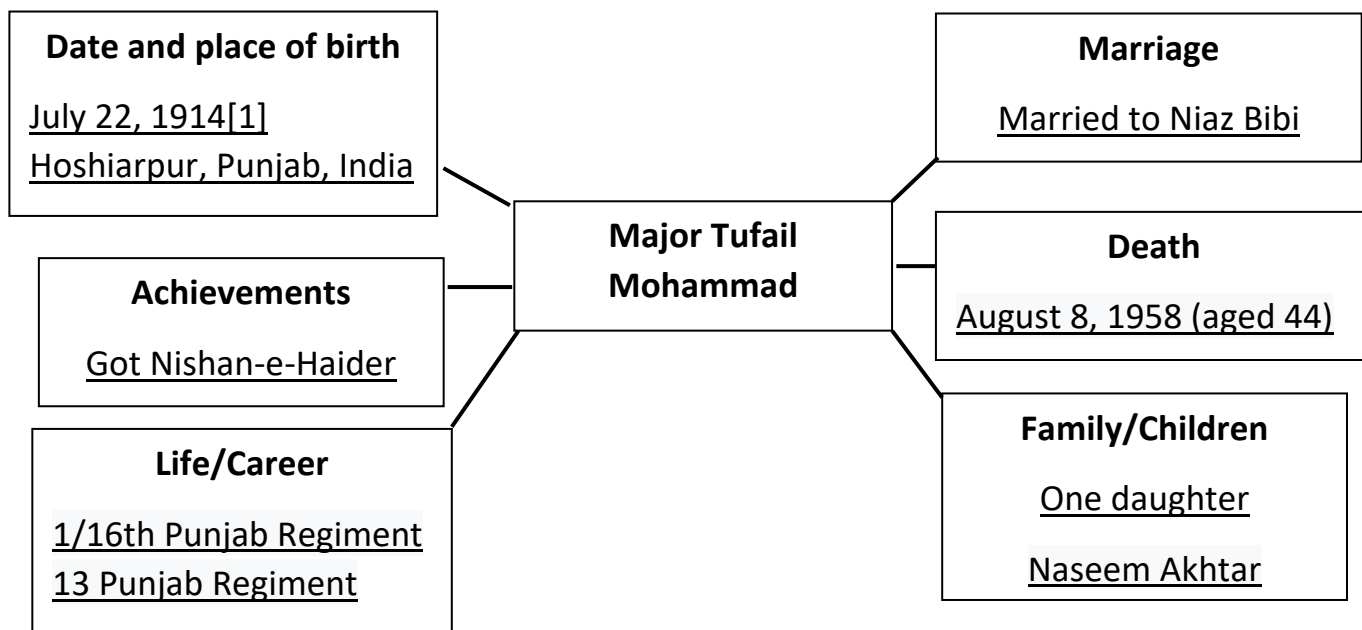

Major Tufail was born in Hoshiarpur in 1914 and commissioned in the 16 Punjab regiment in 1943. After a distinguished career, he was posted to the East Pakistan Rifles in 1958 as a Company Commander. In August, Indian troops captured a village in East Pakistan. Major divided his men into three groups and decided to launch the assault during the dark hours of 7th August. When his group was about 15 yards from the enemy, they came under heavy fire and three bullets entered his stomach. Despite the shower of blood from his stomach, he kept moving forward and silenced the machinegun with a grenade.

When he noticed that the commander of the Indian army was trying to attack one of his men, he crawled toward him and stretched out one of his legs and hit him in the face with his steel helmet. Major continued directing the operation until the enemy was driven out leaving behind four dead and three prisoners. Due to loss of so much blood, he fell on the ground, and then got up and said to his officer “I have completed my duty, the enemy is on the run”. He was taken to the hospital but he later died the same day on 7 August 1958 at the age of 44. He left a widow and a daughter.

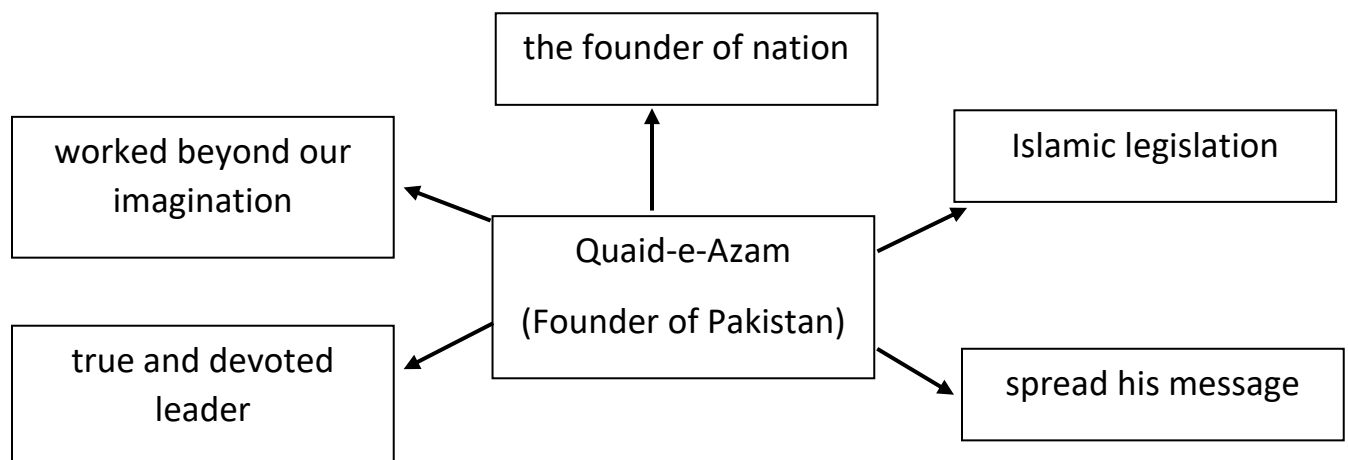
